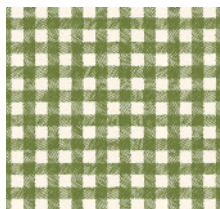

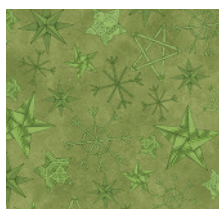

Fabric 2	10557-G	3/8 yard
Fabric 3	10556-G	1/3 yard
Fabric 4	10552-G	1/8 yard
Fabric 5	10555-G	1/8 yard
Fabric 6	10554-G	1/2 yard
Fabric 7	10558-G Includes binding	1 yard
Fabric 8	10555-R	1/4 yard
Backing	cut LOF	1-3/4 yards

WOF - Width of Fabric
LOF - Length of Fabric
RST - Right Sides Together
HST - Half Square Triangle

Cutting

Placemats: 12" x 18", Runner: 12" x 48"

Fabric 1 Background

A (16) 4" x 4" squares for HSTs

B (24) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares

C (8) 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles

D (8) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 2

E (8) 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles

G (8) 4" x 4" squares

H (4) 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 3

I (8) 4" x 4" squares

J (16) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares.

Fabrics 4, 5

K (4) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

Fabric 6

L (4) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

M (32) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares

Fabric 7

N (16) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

Binding

Cut (6) 2-1/4" x WOF strips.

Fabric 8

O (8) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

Directional Fabrics

Pay attention to the directional fabrics when cutting the F4 rectangles.

Homemade Holidays Set Instructions

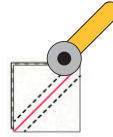
Please read all instructions before you begin. Seam allowance is 1/4".
Fabric is abbreviated as 'F' and by number. For example, Fabric 1 is 'F1'.

Make 2-at-a-time HST Units

(Half Square Triangles)

1. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the F1-A squares.
2. Place an F1-A square and an F2-G square, RST (right sides together) and sew 1/4" away from either side of the marked line.
3. Cut on the marked line. Press away from F1. Make 8 pairs for 16 F1/F2 HSTs. Trim to 3-1/2" x 3-1/2".
4. Repeat the steps above with the F1-A and the F3-I squares for a total of 8 pairs and 16 F1/F3 HSTs.

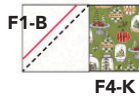

Make the Flying Geese Units

1. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the F1-B squares.
2. Place an F1-B square, RST, on the left side of an F4-K rectangle and sew on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the stitched line. Press.
3. Place an F1-B square, RST, on the right side of the same unit. Stitch on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the stitched line. Press.
4. Repeat the steps above to make the flying geese units illustrated to the right.

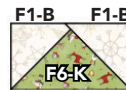

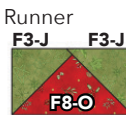

Triangle Block Runner

Tree Block Placemats

Row 1

1. Sew an F1/F2 HST to either side of an F4/F1 flying geese unit. Press.

Row 2

2. Sew an F5/F1 flying geese unit on top of an F6/F1 flying geese unit. Press.

3. Sew an F1-D rectangle to either side of the step 2 unit.

Row 3

4. Sew an F1-C rectangle to either side of an F2-H rectangle. Press.

5. Sew an F1/F2 HST to either side of the Step 4 unit.

Assembly & Finishing

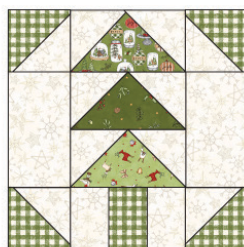
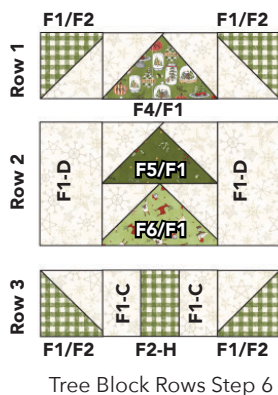
6. Arrange the following units into three rows as illustrated in the top illustration to the right. Sew row to row and press.

7. Sew an F2-E rectangle to opposite sides of the tree block. Press.

8. Repeat the steps to make 4 placemats.

9. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and placemat top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.

10. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.

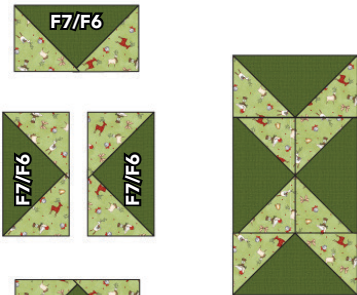

Double Triangle Blocks

Center Triangle Units

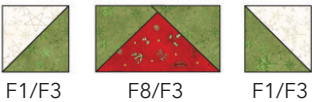
- 1. Arrange four F7/F6 flying geese units into three rows as illustrated to the right.
- 2. Sew the center geese units together and press.
- 3. Sew the rows together to make the center triangle unit. Make 4.

Side Triangle Units

- 4. Sew an F1/F3 HST to either side of an F3/F8 flying geese unit to make the side triangle unit. Press. Make 8.

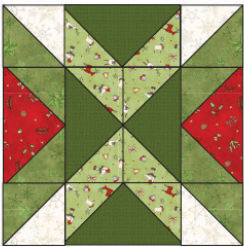
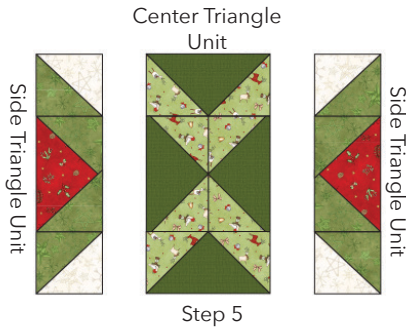


Block Assembly

- 5. Sew a step 4 side triangle unit to either side of a center triangle unit. Press. Make 4.
- 6. Arrange the Double Triangle blocks into one row of 4 blocks as illustrated on p.7.
- 7. Sew the blocks together into the runner top. Press.

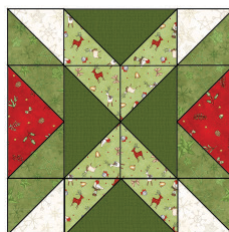
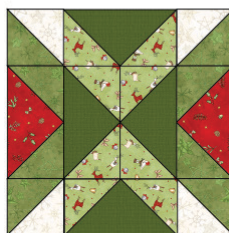
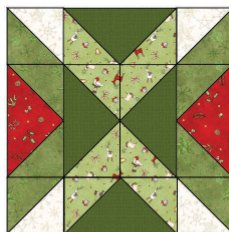
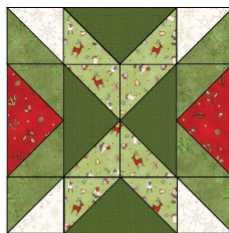


Double Triangle Block

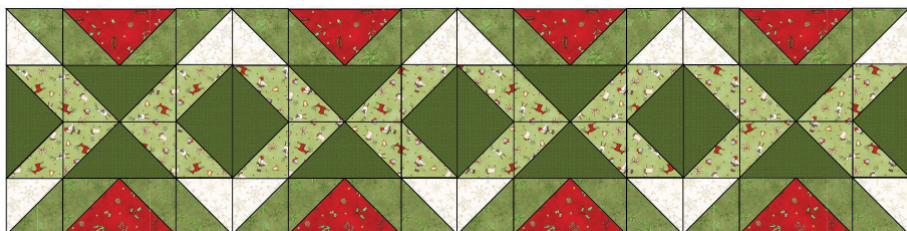
Finishing

1. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and runner top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.

2. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.

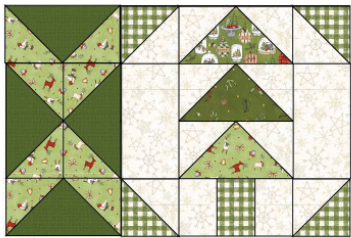

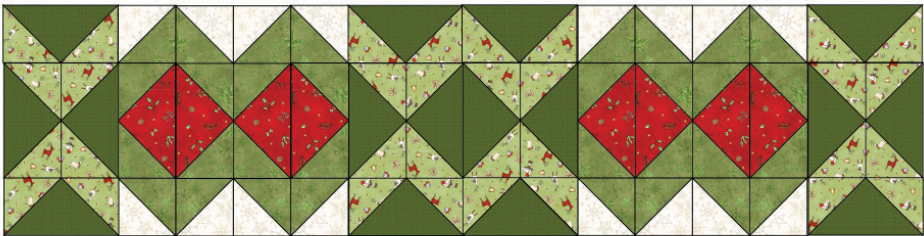
